Ghana — GraceLife Institute & Evangelists Training, July 3-17.

Our team (Roger Fankhauser, Richard Grubbs, Ken Parlin, Tim Hill) will visit two cities to continue training pastors and evangelists. We will also graduate many of these leaders. These leaders take our teaching on the gospel and the Bible and share it enthusiastically in their churches and communities. The three conferences will cost about \$10,000.

Burundi — GraceLife Institute Training, August 9-15.

In our first week, we will teach third-year courses to about 100 Burundian pastors and also minister to women and youth with our team (Charlie Bing, Richard Grubbs, Marvin Effa, Todd Mathis, Sara Stevenson, Jenny Wall, Tracy Hallak, Amy Effa). Our partner, Pastor Anicet Ndikuriyo, has planted over 50 grace-oriented churches. We train these pastors. Estimated cost is about \$19,000.

Democratic Republic of Congo & Rwanda — GraceLife Institute Training, August 18-20.


This conference will take place in our second week in Burundi as these pastors make the long trip across the border to attend. This is the most efficient way for us to reach them. They report a severe need for grace-oriented Bible teaching in their home countries. To train them will cost about \$9,000.

Our Spanish version of Simply by Grace (Simplemente por Gracia) reached behind prison bars. In broken English, Cuban Luis C. wrote from prison:

When I read your book I cry like a baby because I learn that I do not lose my salvation. . . I write to thank

you from my heart and freeing me from legalism and works and helping me to understand salvation. Now I can serve God with a pure heart not because I want to keep my salvation, but because I love Him for saving me and keeping me saved.

. . . This past Wednesday I had the opportunity to share in church services the difference between being saved and being a disciple of Christ and I almost got stoned. . . Many people come here and tell my brothers that in order to be saved and have eternal life, they have to surrender to the Lord, they need to obey His commandment, they need to walk in the Spirit, they need to do work. What a shame that those people pervert the gospel of Christ, the gospel of grace. You should see their faces. I almost cry.

At the end one came to me and stretch my hand and thank me for explain to him that believe in Jesus and trust in Him is the only way to have eternal life. Only one received the word in good soil.
